CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Overview

- Trade schools, also called career schools, vocational schools, or technical schools, teach students curriculum based on a specific skilled trade
- Apprenticeships are learning a skill or trade on the job, and you can start earning money right away
- Trade school students and apprentices typically need to have at least graduated high school or have the equivalent of a high school education, like a GED, although there are some apprentice programs that may allow students to start learning the trade while still in high school
